The Watauga Arts Council (WAC) fosters a thriving, diverse, and vibrant creative community through arts advocacy, education, support, and inspiration.

Serving professional and emerging artists, WAC facilitates and provides a structure for arts initiatives that enrich the lives of artists, residents, and visitors alike.

### Watauga Arts Economic Impact Snapshot

Creative Industries data comes from Riverbed Research commissioned by the Western NC Arts Agencies. Arts nonprofit data comes from the Arts & Economic Impact Survey that included 20 Watauga arts nonprofits. The numbers listed here are specific to Watauga County. \$16.8m

Organized and supported countless arts related events, including Buskers Fest and Boonerang Music and Arts Festival.

Launched the area's first online Arts Directory - a hub for finding the arts in the High Country. We also produced the area's first paper Arts Map.

# BIG ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2023...



## 26,000 + impacted by our events and community center

We average 250 people per week, 7 days a week, at the Watauga Arts Council on Shadowline Drive, between classes and community groups, and nonprofit support. Direct events we helped facilitate drew more than 14,000 people.

## 500+ Artists participated in opportunities to sell and

## 3 Sculptures and 1 Mural Installed

## \$11,000 Received to Plan Art in the Outdoors

We applied for and won an \$11k grant to develop our Art in the Outdoors initiative to create a public arts strategic plan for Watauga County.

We had the privilege of hosting 16 North Carolina Arts Council Board of Directors for an annual board meeting. This made a great impression!

## Launched an online arts directory and paper arts map

We successfully launched HighCountryArts.org and the Explore the Arts Map to help draw attention to the Arts Sector in Watauga County. Arts tourists consistently twice as much as tourists for other industries.




